## MSU's Anderson scores 30 in loss to Northern State

**ABERDEEN, S.D.** — Minnesota State University junior forward Luke Anderson extended his streak of scoring at least 20 points in a game to five on Saturday with a career-best 30-point effort against Northern State. It wasn't enough for the Mavericks, however, as they were knocked off 77-63 in the championship game of the Super 8/Bob Wachs Men's Basketball Classic.

Anderson's career-high 30 points came on 11-of-16 shooting from the floor, including 4-of-6 from 3-point range. Junior guards Paris Kyles and Tony Thomason added 11 and 10 points, respectively, while senior center Chris Whitfield had a team-best eight rebounds.

Northern State was led by Aaron Busack's 16 points and 10 rebounds. NSU's all-region player, Matt Hammer, scored 13 points. Also reaching double-digits for the Wolves were Craig Nelson and Levi Hamilton with 12 and 11 points each.

ed MSU 40-31. The Mavericks made 6-of-18 3-point attempts and both teams combined for just 21 turnovers.

Minnesota State held a 23-21 advantage with 10:06 left in the first half before the Wolves poured in 16 straight points.

The rally gave Northern State a 37-26 lead with just over four minutes remaining before the break.

MSU was able to close to within 12 points five minutes into the second half, but again Northern State outscored MSU 14-0 over the next six minutes to put the game away.

The Mavericks (3-1) return to action Wednesday when they travel to Fayette, Iowa, to take on Upper Iowa in a 7 p.m. nonconference game.
