Andrews receives third NCC honor

MANKATO — For the third consecutive season, Minnesota State center Arin Andrews has been named to the All-North Central Conference women's basketball team.

Andrews is only the second Minnesota State player to receive the award three times, joining Lisa Walters, who was named all-conference in 1986, 1987 and 1988.

Andrews finished her senior season as the Mavericks' leading scorer and rebounder, posting 375 points and 239 rebounds. Her averages of 13.4 points and 8.5 rebounds ranked ninth and fourth, respectively, in the NCC. She also finished seventh in the league in field goal percentage (.527), 13th in blocked shots (1.35 per game) and 15th in free throw per-

centage (.713).

For her career, she scored 1,200 points, which ranked ninth in program history, and grabbed 784 rebounds, which is seventh-best. She also ranks in Top 10 at Minnesota State for free throws made (sixth, 253), field goals made (eighth, 482) and points per game (tied 10th, 12.0).

Andrews scored 20 or more points on 11 occasions and recorded 29 double-doubles. She earned NCC player of the

week honors on three occasions.

North Dakota's Gene Roebuck was named coach of the year, and Kristi Boese received the most valuable player award. North Dakota's Carissa Jahner and Augustana's Ashley Holiday split the defensive honor, Augustana's Chelsea DeVille was the top freshman, and Nebraska-Omaha's Ashley Freerksen was the newcomer of the year.
